Her most significant teachers belonged to the first generation of the world-famous Pina Bausch dance ensemble. With further educational training courses in Germany and abroad, she is constantly expanding her vocabulary in a wide variety of dance styles. This training has always been part of her work around the world as a stage dancer, dance choreographer, ice show skater, ice show and figure skating choreographer and dance instructor for figure skaters. Developing her own special training method, she teaches off ice and on ice dance lessons for targeted figure skaters. Elisa has devoted herself intensively to contemporary skating since 2010.
